I am curious if you allow black water tank draining (sewage and waste water from a trailer or RV) at your facility? I understand if there is a fee for it. Dan

Everyone is allowed to use our dump station. If you're camping, it is included with your camping fees. If you'd like to just drive into the park to empty the tank, enter the right side of the kiosk and pay a \$15 charge to use our dump station.

I went for the first time to Doheny yesterday and frankly I love the waves. I am a beginner surfer and the waves are perfect for beginners. However, I just read this is the most polluted beach in Orange County together with San Clemente. Is that still true? I read old articles written 3 or 5 years ago. Is it safe at the beach nowadays? Is the contamination level improved?


I also saw a lot of stones and not sandy beach where the waves break, is this normal year-round? Thanks for your info because I really like the beach and it would be unfortunate to know that it is polluted. Maynor

Doheny waters can be polluted but are not so all the time and things are <u>much</u> better now than in the past. Doho's pollution comes from a number of sources. 1) In the winter and because of rains washing out San Juan Creek, pollutions levels go up because of what's washed down from the creek. It's best not to go out during and right after rains. Give the water 3 days or so to clean up. 2) The pond that forms on the beach caused by San Juan Creek is an estuary and used by many birds, increased because we're on the Pacific Flyway for many migrating birds at various times of the year. When it rains and the water from the estuary breaks through the berm and flows into the ocean, out goes the pollution (think bird poop). There are also many seagulls that float out off shore when there is low or no surf, especially when there are lots of small bait fish (grunion) in the water (more bird poop). 3) There is pollution that flows out of the harbor, although not nearly as much now as in the past. 4) Doheny is a very popular beach and some visitors are trashy folks who leave trash that gets washed into the water. All that said, Doho is not the most polluted beach in the OC. It gets good grades most of the year from Surfrider and from Heal the Bay. Doheny is much cleaner than it was even 5 years ago and I don't have any problem with my kids, my grandkids or me out in the water there. We rarely hear of anyone getting any type of infection due to pollution, no more than from any other beach, and this usually happens in the winter when the person had been surfing just after storms and water was washing out from the creek.


By the way, most of San Clemente's waters are fine, too. The most polluted water is around the pier due to storm drain impact. Other beaches can be bad after rains (Poche, Riviera, Calafia), but again, giving the water a

few days to settle after a storm and things are fine.

The rocks are there at Doheny all year. A solution to consider is to wear rubber reef walkers. Not only do they allow you to walk across the rocks nearly pain free, but they also give your feet a better grip on the board. Enjoy the waves at Doheny.

<u>AUTUMN EQUINOX IS SEPT. 22nd, 6:30 AM:</u> During the equinox, the sun crosses what is called the "celestial equator." Imagine a line that marks the equator on Earth extending up into the sky above the equator from north to south. Earth's northern and southern hemispheres receive the sun's rays about equally. The sun is overhead at noon as seen from the equator, so at this point, the amount of nighttime and daytime (sunlight) are roughly equal to each other. By the way, happy first day of spring to our friends in the southern hemisphere.



SUNRISE / SUNSET:

September 1st: Sunrise @ 6:23 AM / Sunset @ 7:12 PM = 12 hrs. 48 mins. 39 secs. of sun.

We lose 1 min. & 55 secs. of sun from the previous day.

September 30th: Sunrise @ 6:42 AM / Sunset @ 6:33 PM = 11 hrs. 51 mins. 13 secs. of sun.
