LORRIN "WHITEY" HARRISON, SURFING PIONEER AND DOHENY LOCAL:

"Whitey" Harrison is a name well known to anyone with even the slightest knowledge of surfing history. He was born in Garden Grove, California in 1913, was a stowaway on a ship to the Hawaiian Islands in the 1930s, a surfer, diver, outrigger paddler, fisherman, an innovator of boards and outriggers, and a man who loved the sea and all its blessings. He surfed from the 1930s into the 1980's. During part of those years, Whitey was a Doheny and Dana Point local. Here's part of an article by Malcolm Gault-Williams covering those years.






Aide receives many questions about day use and camping in the park. Have a question? Send it to <u>info@dohenystatebeach.org</u>. You'll get an email reply.

I know there are no hookups for RVs in the campground, but are we allowed to use the fresh water spigots to fill our clean water tanks once we get to our designated site? Or is there fresh water spigots at the dump site? Marilyn

Water in the campground spigots is potable water. Yes, good for drinking and campers may fill their water tanks with them. The hose at the dump station should not be used to fill potable water tanks or drink and there is a sign there saying not to do so. If visitors want to fill water tanks at the dump station, they must pull forward by 15 yards and fill from the potable water spigot found at that spot.

California State Parks just launched its new Dual Language Virtual Junior Rangers Adventure video series with associated activities. The topics addressed in this dual language—Spanish and English—video series are geology; tide pools; California Tribes: Chumash; weather and climate; native plants; and native animals. The activities can be found at http://kids.parks.ca.gov/?page_id=22783. Children who participate in Junior Rangers, a statewide program for ages 7-12 years old, receive a digital badge for each virtual adventure completed.

CALIFORNIA'S BIODIVERSITY CHALLENGE: Of any state in the U.S., California has both the highest



total number of species and the highest number of endemic species (i.e., those that occur nowhere else). We also have the most rare and imperiled species of any state with more than 30% of California's species threatened with extinction! California is one of the most biodiverse regions in the world and one of 36 Global Biodiversity Hotspots designated by Conservation International. These are areas containing exceptional concentrations of plant and animal endemism, but also experiencing high rates of habitat loss.
